2018 was named the “Year of the Bird” by several nationally recognized groups like National Geographic, National Audubon Society, and Cornell Lab of Ornithology.

National Audubon Society, National Geographic, the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and others named 2018 the Year of the Bird, in honor of the 100th Anniversary of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act. Even before that, Bucks Audubon was increasing our bird related programs. For many years, we had gotten away from birds and focused on other nature topics and our wonderful historic Honey Hollow Watershed. While all of these things help us to meet our mission, our community wanted to see more birds.

So, over the past year or so, we have added and strengthened some programs that help us to celebrate birds.

Some of the great bird related programs you can find going on at Bucks Audubon:

- **Saturday Morning Bird Walks** - The 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month, join us at either our Creamery Rd. location or at local parks throughout the county for birdwatching!
- **Birding Field Trips** - Each spring and fall we hop into our cars and explore a site that promises great birds.
- **Winter Birding Bonanza** - Each winter flock to birds with our annual Owl Prowl, Birding 101: Intro to Bird Watching, the National Audubon Society Photography Awards Exhibit, and a great speaker on birding and bird photography.
- **Education Programs for Students** - Birds have become the central focus on many of our programs for school children, including Bird Explorer (a four-part series of lessons for pre-school children), and Climate Change & Birds that explores how local birds are impacted by the changing climate for middle-school students.

*The opportunity to connect people to nature through birds is an Audubon tradition that we are happy to continue now and into the future!*

## REACHING ALL CHILDREN

With a goal of serving schools and children throughout the county, Bucks Audubon continues to offer environmental and science education programs to schools in low-income communities. The *STEM In the Watershed* program for 3rd and 4th grade students in the Bristol Area connects hundreds of students to nature and also helps to prepare these students for their Science PSSA tests in 4th grade. This program continues to be funded by the **VWR Foundation**.

Bucks Audubon also continues to work with Pre-School children through our *Head Start Science Enrichment* program. This program introduces 3-5 year olds to birds and nature through sensory exploration, movement, and stories. Thanks to the **Kate Svitek Memorial Foundation** and the **PA Department of Environmental Protection** for funding this amazing program!

Our *STEM In the Watershed* and *Head Start Science Enrichment* programs were started in 2016 and continue to thrive!

## CLIMATE CHANGE & BIRDS

Bucks Audubon is excited to have been approved as an Educational Improvement Organization by Pennsylvania, which makes us eligible for Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) funding! EITC allows businesses to fund innovative education programs for schools. We have been able to start a new program for middle-school students on Climate Change and Birds, thanks to an EITC gift from **Waste Management**. The Climate Change and Birds program provides both in-class and field experiences for students as they explore the important science of climate change and its impact on local bird species.

## STEAM CLUB FOR GIRLS

In early elementary, an equal amount of girls and boys have positive attitudes for science, but by 8th grade, boys are twice as interested in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) subjects. This trend continues throughout highschool and college. To help reverse this, Bucks Audubon brought a 10 week after-school club just for girls to Poquessing Middle School in spring 2018. The *STEAM Club for Girls* added an art lens to the different science topics covered, while engaging 21 5<sup>th</sup> grade girls in science inquiry. This wonderful program was supported by **Foundations Community Partnership**.

As Bucks Audubon looks to engage more with the community, we opened up our Organic Garden to the public!

As our #1 teaching tool, our property is a valued part of Bucks Audubon and we are always looking for ways to improve and protect it. In the past year, a number of changes and additions have happened on the property, including benches from an Eagle Scout, the grand opening of our Healing Garden, opening our organic vegetable garden to the community, and new docks on Many Springs Pond.

Just off of our parking lot is a wonderful and tranquil spot, our Healing Garden! Thanks to the support of **Foundations Community Partnership**, we were able to enclose and create a small garden that is designed for children and adults with autism and special needs. The garden provides a quiet and safe place for them to explore nature through horticulture therapy programs. We are currently working on a curriculum to be used in the garden that is funded through **PECO** and **Foundations Community Partnership**.

A longtime partnership between Bucks Audubon, Heritage Conservancy and the Crooks Family has allowed us to teach programs at the Tuckamony property. One of the favorite spots on the property for exploration is Many Springs Pond. With a diversity of aquatic wildlife, school children and naturalists could regularly be seen at the pond until a few years ago. Unfortunately, the popularity of the pond was having a negative impact and programming at the pond had to be stopped. **Malcolm and Elaine Crooks** wanted to see the children back at the pond, so they very generously donated the funds to build new educational docks. The docks allow the children to explore and discover without negative impacts. We can't thank **Malcolm and Elaine** enough for their support!

## EARTH DAY FESTIVAL

This great event is perfect celebration of our mission and a fabulous “friend-raiser” with people coming from Philadelphia, Reading, and all parts of Bucks County for the event. 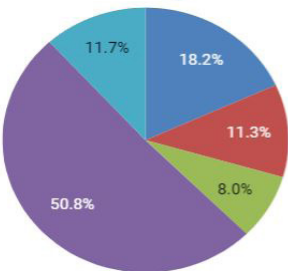

Total - \$331,067

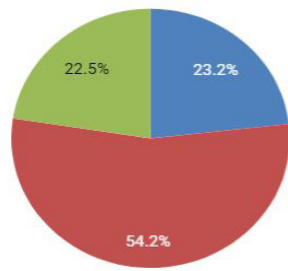

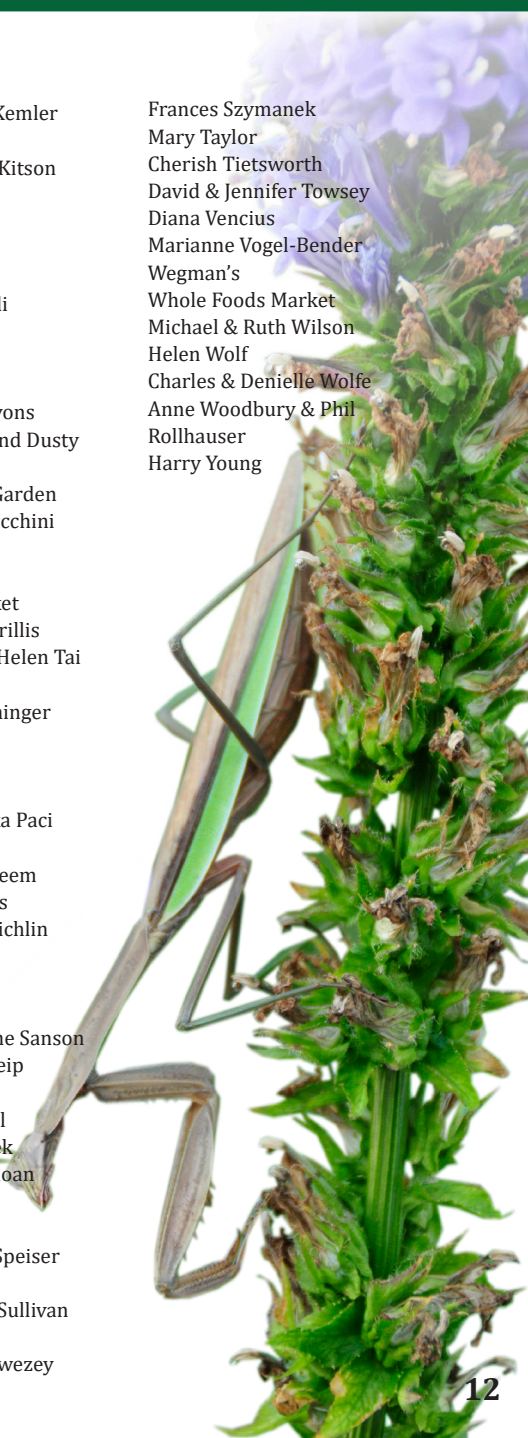
